## **What is The Mission Impossible Event?**

It is a circuit of teamwork challenges (Impossible Missions) that teams of 4 to 7 participants have to work together to complete and gain points. The event is presented along theme of the Mission Impossible film series, with participants being told that they are on a training event for new IM Agents.

At each Impossible Mission activity station, there is a mission dossier with instructions and pictures to give them a clue as to how to complete the mission. Each Impossible Mission is presented as a scenario. A facilitator accompanies each group around the circuit of missions to ensure the group understand the challenges, check they stick to the rules and to facilitate discuss about their teamwork and their problem-solving strategies. The number and nature of the challenges will depend on the size of your group and the time you have.

## **What it can be used for:**

- Corporate day Icebreaker
- Department Away Days
- School Multi-activity day – Start or end of year visits.
- Transition Year event

## **Note**

We can come to you! The equipment is easy to transport to your School grounds. We've run this in a Sports Hall for Ashton 6thForm, on the Playing fields for a number of Primary and Secondary Schools.

## **Primary benefits:**

- Fun teambuilding with tailored outcomes
- The hands on challenges are physical and cognitive and require team interaction.
- Character traits and group dynamics come to light when groups are tasked.
- Competitive and co-operative team interaction required.

## **Secondary benefit:**

- Delegation
- Leadership
- Strategy development
- Time management

Team size: 4 to 7. Have run this for year groups of 80 at a time, split into groups.

Length: Minimum of 1.5 hours, maximum of 3 hours

Space requirements: This is best done as an outdoor event

Note: if you have less room or space, we can do a shorter Teamwork Challenge version without spending extra time on the themed version.
